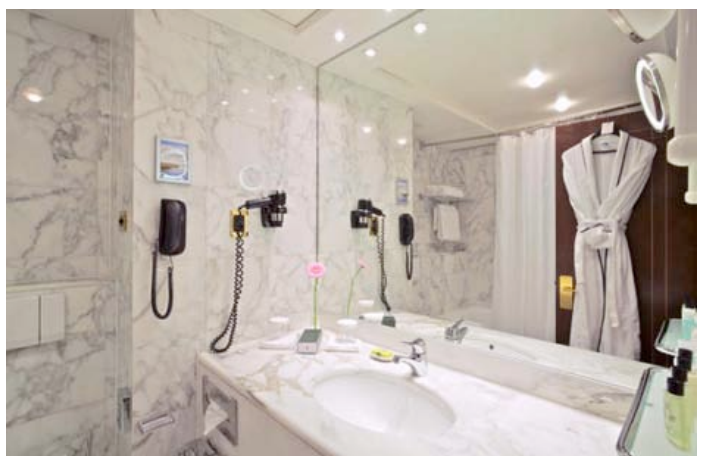

### Golf Course Albatross

### Golf Course Beroun

This project of Canadian architect Les Furber, is evidence of his incredible skill in placing an 18holes championship course in the countryside as it has always been here. Even with the use of every available modern technology for construction and further maintenance, it demonstrates a deep respect for nature and the surrounding countryside.

The 18-hole championship course was built inside a former military area, lined with forests of the Brdy mountain range. The course spreads over 160 acres (650 thousand sqm) of land, has an evenly balanced mix of flat and and hills, and a total of 70 sand bunkers as well as 4 artificial lakes.



## GOLF COURSES

### Golf Course Karlštejn

The first 18 holes of the Golf Resort Karlštejn were opened in 1993. The project comes from workshop of two Canadian golf architects, Les Furber and Jim Eremko. The names of these architects are signed under 70 golf courses around the world. Two of the most famous are definitely "Valderama" in Spain or "Varadero" in Cuba. Thanks to sensitive approach of integrating the golf course into picturesque countryside, where the romantic scenery comprises of the most famous Czech castle Karlštejn, the residence of the Czech kings, unique place was created. Hilly landscape with limestone rocks, rich fauna and flora is an oasis of calmness and peace which will gratify event the most demanding players.



### Golf Course Konopiste

The master 18-hole course, the course length is 6,484 meters from black (professional) teeing areas. In cooperation with the European PGA it was possible to create a course sensitively embedded in the landscape with slight terrain waves, with an interesting forest section, many bunkers and water hazards, and especially with high-quality, large and lovely modeled greens. The course name "Radecký" is derived from one of the original owners of the estate, famous marshal from the Napoleonic Wars - Václav Radecký of Radeč.

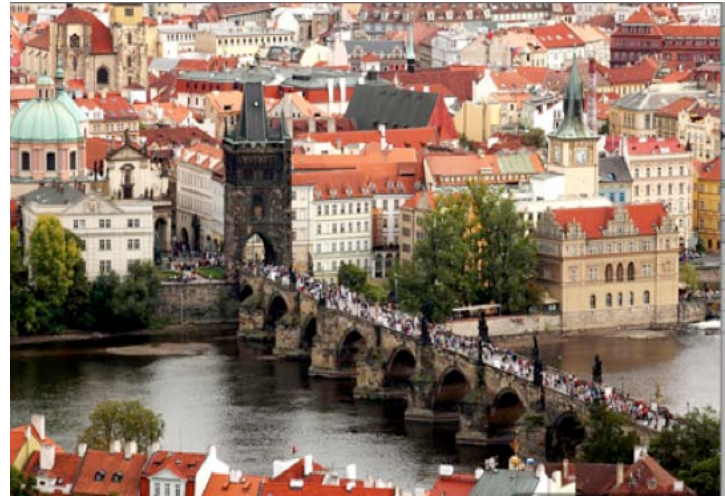


## EXCURSION FOR GOLFERS AND NON-GOLFERS

### Prague Grand City Sightseeing Tour

After leaving an hotel, we embark on a fascinating journey through time, to discover the people who have shaped the city, and learn about the places they built - Prague has over 4,000 monuments.

We begin on the coach, introducing the major historical areas of Prague: Prague Castle, Saint Vitus Cathedral, the New Town with Wenceslass Square at its heart, the charming Old Town and the picturesque Lesser Town. You will see the Charles Bridge, the Jewish Quarter and the Old Town Square.



## EXCURSION FOR NON-GOLFERS

### Karlovy Vary

After picking you up from your hotel, we'll drive for around two hours to Karlovy Vary, the city, which is located near to the German border.

Karlovy Vary was established in the Middle Ages after the discovery of hot mineral springs. It is a serene, beautiful place with gracious colonnades and picturesque boulevards. A deep forest surrounds the spa town.

The invigorating waters are used to treat all kinds of health disorders and for general well-being. Past visitors include the Russian tsar Peter the Great and the poet Johann Wolfgang von Goethe. Both praised the healing effects of the mineral springs.

12 hot springs are currently in use. The best known spring is Vridlo, which belches its curative water to a height of 12m. Our walking tour of Karlovy Vary includes a taste of these waters. On the way back, you will visit a glass factory called Moser.



## EXCURSION FOR NON-GOLFERS

### Cesky Krumlov + Hluboka nad Vltavou

A full day sightseeing tour to the beautiful medieval town of Cesky Krumlov. Located in the south of the Czech Republic, Cesky Krumlov is protected by UNESCO as a world heritage site and is one of the country's most attractive places to visit after Prague.

This sightseeing tour is part by air-conditioned coach, part on foot.

After picking you up from your Prague hotel, we will drive for around 2½ hours through the scenic Bohemian countryside to reach Cesky Krumlov.

We begin our walking tour with a guided visit of the main attraction, the mighty Renaissance castle, once the seat of the powerful lords the Rožmberks and the Schwarzenbergs. The castle houses offer a rich collection of period furniture, Flemish tapestries and historical weapons.

After visiting the Cesky Krumlov, you will be taken to the Hluboka Castle.

Traveling through the beautiful south Bohemia countryside, you will arrive at Hluboka Chateau, which was rebuilt in the spirit of the romantic English Gothic style, based on royal Windsor Castle. It was the wish of the countess Elizabeth Schwarzenberg, who was invited in 1837 at the Queen Victoria's coronation to England and had the opportunity to see the Royal Castle. After the arrival to Hluboka, she persuaded her husband to reconstruct their palace into the castle seen in Windsor. In the Czech Republic, it is a rare example of the English architecture.

## DESCRIPTION OF EXCURSIONS

### Budapest

Budapest - cited as one of the most beautiful cities in Europe, its extensive World Heritage Site includes the banks of the Danube, the Buda Castle Quarter, Andrassy Avenue, Heroes' Square and the Millennium Underground Railway, the second oldest in the world. Other highlights include a total of 80 geothermal springs. The world's largest thermal water cave system, second largest synagogue, and third largest Parliament building.



### Vienna

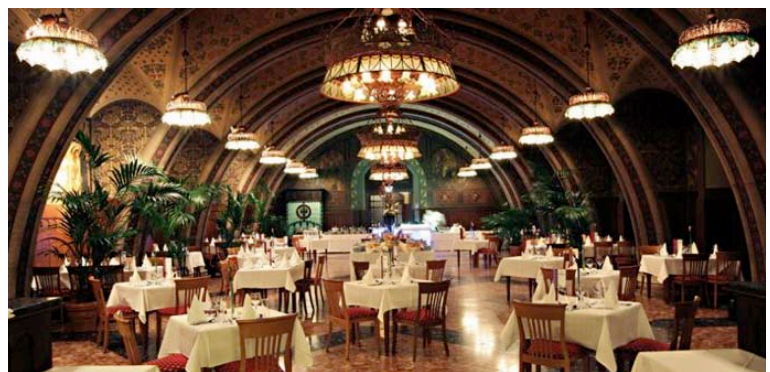
Vienna is the capital and largest city of Austria, and one of the nine states of Austria. It is the 7th-largest city by population within city limits in the European Union. Apart from being regarded as the City of Music because of its musical legacy, Vienna is also said to be "The City of Dreams" because it was home to the world's first psycho-analyst - Sigmund Freud. Each year since 2005, Vienna has been the world's number one destination for international congresses and conventions. Vienna attracts about five million tourists a year.



### Restaurant «WIENER RATHAUSKELLER»

Since its completion in 1883, Vienna's Rathaus, or City Hall, has been the headquarters of the city and provincial government. Architect Friedrich Schmidt designed the basement vault as a place for "food and drink".

In 1899, Rathauskeller was inaugurated by then Mayor of Vienna Dr. Karl Lueger with a toast to "His Imperial and Royal Apostolic Majesty, Emperor Franz Josef I", and to this day it is known as the home of "good taste"



## Schönbrunn Palace

Schönbrunn Palace is a former imperial 1,441-room Rococo summer residence in modern Vienna, Austria. One of the most important cultural monuments in the country, since the 1960s it has been one of the major tourist attractions in Vienna. The palace and gardens illustrate the tastes, interests, and aspirations of successive Habsburg monarchs.



## Salzburg

Salzburg's "Old Town" (Altstadt) has internationally renowned baroque architecture and one of the best-preserved city centers north of the Alps. It was listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1997. Salzburg was the birthplace of 18th-century composer Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. In the mid-20th century, the city was the setting for parts of the musical play and film "The Sound of Music".



## Linderhof Palace

Linderhof Palace is in Germany, in southwest Bavaria near Ettal Abbey. It is the smallest of the three palaces built by King Ludwig II of Bavaria and the only one which he lived to see completed.



## Neuschwanstein Castle

"New Swanstone Castle" is a nineteenth-century Romanesque Revival palace on a rugged hill above the village of Hohenschwangau near Füssen in southwest Bavaria, Germany. The palace was commissioned by Ludwig II of Bavaria as a retreat and as a homage to Richard Wagner. Ludwig paid for the palace out of his personal fortune and by means of extensive borrowing, rather than Bavarian public funds.

The palace was intended as a personal refuge for the reclusive king, but it was opened to the paying public immediately after his death in 1886. Since then more than 61 million people have visited Neuschwanstein Castle. More than 1.3 million people visit annually, with as many as 6,000 per day in the summer. The palace has appeared prominently in several movies and was the inspiration for Disneyland's Sleeping Beauty Castle and later, similar structures.



## Munich

Munich is the capital and largest city of the German state of Bavaria. It is located on the River Isar north of the Bavarian Alps. Its native name, *München*, is derived from the Old High German *Munichen*, meaning "by the monks' place". Munich was first mentioned in 1158. From 1255 the city was seat of the Bavarian Dukes, it was an imperial residence from 1328 and in 1506 became the sole capital of Bavaria



## Nuremberg

Nuremberg is a city in the German state of Bavaria, in the administrative region of Middle Franconia. Situated on the Pegnitz river and the Rhine–Main–Danube Canal, it is located about 170 kilometers (110 mi) north of Munich. It is the second-largest city in Bavaria (after Munich), and is the largest in Franconia. The population as of December 2011, is 510,602, which makes it Germany's fourteenth largest city. The "European Metropolitan Area Nuremberg" has 3.5 million inhabitants.
